



The fogginess of the water is measured by turbidity, which uses light to pass through water and determines the suspended particles within it and can help identify harmful substances. These particles can act as a shield to harmful microorganisms within the water and hide them from water treatments. Youth also used Education test kit equipment to sample the fish in Pigeon Lake. The Education test kit consisted of tools such as thermometers, conductivity meters, test strips, reacher sticks, and sample cups. Also, the participants would

On July 18th, 2023. Tiran (Tee-rawn) Smallboy-Zorthian took Samson Cree Nation's Tipahaskahn Kamik Energy team to Mountain Cree/Smallboy Camp. He was also accompanied by a council member Armand Swampy. There in the Camp Tiran Gathered the elders to host a prayer ceremony, to acknowledge the completion of the 3-month probation period for the IODI Coordinator position within SCN.

On March 20th, Tiran agreed to be the Energy Champion for the Indigenous Off-Diesel Initiative (IODI) program, Samson Cree Nation applied for the grant on behalf of the Camp. IODI Energy Champions, are then required to participate in a capacity building program called "20/20 Catalyst Program". Energy Champions then travel to three locations, learning about Indigenous-led Renewable Energy Projects across Canada. Tiran has completed the 20/20 Catalyst program during the 3 months probation period with SCN. With the completion of the 3-month probation period and, 20/20 Catalyst program. Tiran is now entering Phase 2 of the IODI program. To begin planning and engaging community members to develop a community energy plan, to determine what is the most suitable Sacred Renewable Energy Project, that can be implemented within the Camps Kisiko Awasis School.



PUBLIC NOTICE August 17, 2023

Samson Cree Nation has created this Public Notice to address the Nation Members concerns regarding the Settlement.

The Samson Cree Nation has NOT received the Breach of Trust (Federal Court Action No. T-2022-89) Settlement Payment from Canada yet. Due to the conditions and timelines imposed by the Government of Canada. Samson Cree Nation should receive all settlement funds sometime in October or November 2023.

Below are some FAQ, hopefully, this can answer the questions nation members have.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is this legal claim (Federal Court Action No. T-2022-89) all about?

Why did SCN members vote in a referendum?

Since SCN feed the Dreach of Trust Claim in 1986, SCN has spent many years pursuing and advancing these claims both inside the courts and through direct negotiations. Chief and Council and Cenada have been able to negotiate an agreement in principle that will settle SCN's remaining claims in the Breach of Trust shaust. Before the agreement in principle could be finalized, Canada required SCN membrain to approve the agreement in principle. This was done through a referendum 50% plus 1 of the members who voted in the referendum needed to vote "yes", to allow Canada and SCN to finalize the settlement agreement and for SCN to collect the settlement money.

The referendum was held on November 15, 2022, and it pleased with 80% of the 1032 voters, voting in favour of the agreement in principle.

How much money is SCN going to get in this settlement?

Since the agreement in principle was approved, SCN and Canada are finalizing the settlement agreement and upon finalization SCN will then be paid \$154 million in cash to compensate SCN for the claims in the Breach of Trust lawsuit.

Out of the \$134 million, how much does SCN keep and what do the lawyers get?

SChi will get 500% of the settlement money. No lawyers get a share of the settlement.

Do the members receive any of the settlement money?

As presented to the membership prior to the referendum, Other and Council intend to distribute 20%, or \$36 it million, directly to SCN members.

Have the members already received any portion of the \$26.8 million distribution?

Yes, the SCN Chief and Council took out a loan to provide \$1000.00 to the Nation's membership. This morely was dehibuled \$300 in December 2002 and \$500 in January 2003. This loan needs to be peed back to the financial multi-state it was borned from with interest.

When do the members get the remainder of the proposed distribution of the settlement money?

SCIs will collect the sufferment money after all the other steps that Canada meats on are completed. This process has taken a number of months due to the complexity of this percoular settlement agreement.

What will happen with the rest of the money SCN collects?

Chief and Council has stated that they intend to allocate the funds as follows. 20% of the settlement will be opcosted into SCN trusts for future governations. 15% of the settlement will be used to pay SCN debts, 35% of the settlement will be used to pay SCN debts, 35% of the settlement will be invested in SCN programs and services. This is subject to changes based on future decisions of Chief and Council.

What else must be done?

Once the Settlement Agreement is finalized. Caracta has a condition that specific SCN lawsuits will be amended, that sevijers certificates must be prepared and aligned, and that Chief and Counch will pass resolutions and aligned, set that Chief and Counch will pass resolutions and aligned, and that the Chief and Counch will pass resolutions and set the Settlement Agreement. SCN will then set the Settlement Agreement to make

sure it is in the interests of SCN members. After this review, Caracta will sign the Retilement Agreement and Interester the settlement money to SCN.

Has SGN gone to court on any of the issues raised in this lawsuit?

Yes, SCN has been to the Federal Court of Appeal on the Issue of whether Careda was allowed to reduce SCN's requises with an OI and Class Export Tax in the 1970s and 1980s. The outst ruled that SCN has negotiating with Careda about the Export Tax having been used to reduce SCN registers and that by 1999 SCN had waited too long to file its Issueut. The Court applied "Ismatisions" legislation to protect Careda from any liability owed to SCN SCN went to the Supreme Court applied "Ismatisions" legislation to protect Careda from any liability owed to SCN SCN income Court applied that as a heaf-like fiduciary Careda should have paid SCN a better interest ratio. However, the Court ruled that Careda was patiented from any liability to SCN because Careda passed is own law that tended have much interest enough be paid to SCN. This meant that Careda could use to them less to get around its obligations to SCN. SCN versit to the Federal Court on the issue of whether SCN's money, that Careda was holding, should be transferred to SCN's protect true. Has SCN collected any money from the Breach of Trust lawsuit?

Yes, as part of the mamanagement of SCN's royates, SCN's and Canada settled one of the accounting issues and in September 2000, SCN's collected 515.5 million for this one error. This lewrout forced Canada to conduct elements audits of the royatible paid to SCN's and required Canada to begin to adjust the royatible collected. The taward allowed SCN' the opportunity to directly participate in the production of oil and gas on our reserve lands and to negotiate bonuses and benefits other than just regulates. The taward allowed SCN' to negotiate directly with importal Dil to ensure that the maximum amount of oil was produced from SCN's Rigoria Late reserve lands as oil production began to stow down. All four Maskwatos Nation templified from SCN's actions in this regard. In: 2005 the Court ordered that SCN's was allowed to transfer all the money held by Canada on behalf of SCN into our lawn private that, the Keonyamman Heritage Trust Fund. Controlling our own money means that error 2005 SCN has received 5213 million more than we would have if the money had sayed with Canada.

Has SCN received any other settlement offers from Canada?

As part of the Sinsoch of Trust Iswault, SCNs and Conside have tried to negotiate a settlement of the Iswault over many years. Because Canada certained that SCN effectively-storing and a story to pursue any Treaty and Aborigania rights and title claims these offers have been set to be respected. Did SCN give up any Treaty or Aboriginal rights and title in this settlement?

No. Chief and Council are recommending this settlement because Canada has agreed to allow SCN to present and pursue its current Treaty and Asongrad rights and title claim against Canada and Alberta. SCN is only setting its co-reserve oil and gas claims against Canada. Any nights (Treaty on Abongrad) off-sessive will continue to be preserved. Canada has also agreed that if SCN wants to, then SCN may continue to pursue any existing or future claims that it may have, on or off inserve, against Alberta or individual oil producers. The negotiations on the amendments to these various claims have been compast.

Did SCN give up any Reserve lands in this vote?

No, this settlement does not involve the surrender of any SCN lands

What was the Chevron lawsuit about and why is it important in this settlement?

Chevron, one of the oil and gais producers on our treserve lands, and Canada made errors and collected too much oil and gas reyeibes. Both Chevron and Canada sued SCN for the return of the reyeibes even though SCN was not exportable and Sci not even indust there was an error. SCN, Chevron, and Canada went to the Alberta Gourl of Appeal on the lases and the Court of Appeal agreed that SCN was not describe, labels to Chevron or Canada for the mistakes made by these two. After the Court of Appeal decision, Canada wanted to go back to Court and raise a new argument, that Canada should be allowed to pursue the claim against the Kaoniyammas Heritage. Trust Fund. As port of this settlement, Canada has agreed to drop its \$7.5 million against SCN or the Kaoniyammas Heritage Trust Fund, regarding the Chevron overpayments.

Why are the Louis Bull and Montana Nation claims against Canada important in this settlement?

Royaltes from Pigeon Lake have been divided between the Maskwads historis based on population. Louis Bull and Brintana have succi Canada and they argue that royaltes should be get in four egus shares. Canada has sued SCN and said that if Canada isstrouted the royaltes incorrectly then SCN is responsible for Canada's error. As part of this settlement, Canada has agreed to drop its dains against SCN and has agreed that Canada will make whole SCN on the Keonlysmans Heritage That Fund if a claim is successfully made by either Louis Bull or Montana Rations.

Was this the best deal SCN can negotiate?

A negotiated settlement of a dispute between two parties is a compromise. Each side gives up something to stiminate the cost of going to court and to alliminate the risk of a negative judgment if they do go to court.
